ITINERARY

Rates from £850.00 per person, based on 15 paying students in twin rooms, with the below inclusions. All groups also benefit from 24-hour emergency assistance, free mobile phone for group leaders, and directional and tourist maps for all participants.

Day 1

AM Orientation session with Anglo Educational Services staff and Police Officer

PM Guided tour of London with coach and accredited guide

Upon arrival in London you will be met by your private motor coach which will transport you to your accommodation. As check-in is not normally until 3pm, arrangements will have been made with the hotel for you to leave your luggage in a secure area. A pack containing any pre-purchased travelcards, plus directional maps, will have been left for the group leader upon arrival. An orientation session will be held for you at Monticello House, the AES Study Centre, in conjunction with AES staff. This session will cover health and safety, how to use public transport, as well as offering you helpful hints for your stay.

Following your orientation session you will board your coach for a 2-3 hour guided tour of London with your private guide. Don't forget your camera, as there will be plenty of opportunities for you to disembark the coach and view all that London has to offer. Your coach will drop you back at your accommodations, where you will be able to check into your rooms.

Day 2

AM No organised activities

PM Lecture on UK Government and Politics

After a free morning to allow recovery from jet-lag, you will make your way independently

to your classroom in the heart of the university district. There, you will be greeted by a Professor who will offer an overview on British life and culture with a focus on Government and Politics. Your lecturer, a specialist in the field, will cover a wide variety of topics pertinent to your field of study, including current affairs, the UK political system and structure, and a comparison of the different political parties. There will also be an overview of the English legal system.

Day 3

AM Visit to The Law Commission. Meeting with senior staff of the Law Commission. You should wear smart attire for this visit

PM Visit to a law reform and human rights charity, meeting with Senior Legal Officer

7.00PM Jack The Ripper Walking tour

Today your morning will commence with a visit to the Law Commission. The LC is the statutory independent body created by the Law Commissions to keep the law under review, and to recommend reform where it is needed. You will meet with senior members of staff to discuss the law process throughout England, how the law is structured, and the work of the LC.

Following free time for lunch, you will proceed via public transport to the offices of one of the UK's leading charities, focusing on law, human rights and promoting improvements to the British Legal System. There you will be meeting with Senior Policy Officers, looking at the organisation as a whole, and the impact it has on the British Justice System. From here you will meet your private guide, an expert on the life of Jack the Ripper, one of London's most notorious criminals. You will visit some of the exact spots where the crimes were committed and hear a full, detailed (and sometimes gruesome) account of the police investigations into his actions.

Day 4

AM Visit to charity campaigning on behalf of victims of torture. Meeting with Press Officer

PM Presentation with leading charity looking at crimes against women.

PM Visit to one of the UK's leading Police Stations. Lecture on Security and Terrorism. You should wear smart attire for this visit

Get ready for a full day today! Your day will commence with visits to 2 charities, each looking at victims of crime and torture both in the UK and throughout the world. You will have the opportunity to speak not only with those involved in the charity, but also victims of torture and crimes. This first-hand experience will enable you to understand the importance of these charities, and the work that they do.

After an independent lunch you will make your way to one of London's largest police stations, where you will meet with one of their leading authorities on Security and Terrorism. Subject to security, you will also be able to undertake a tour of the custody suite and interview rooms, and even get to try out the cells.

Day 5

AM Walking tour-Lecture on the history of policing in the UK and foundation of Scotland Yard. Focus: Development of policing by consent, the law and Parliament.

PM Visit to the Crown Prosecution Service, with talk given by a Senior Policy Advisor and Colleagues.

Make sure you are wearing your walking shoes this morning, as you will be taking in the sights of London with your own private guide. Your tour guide, a former police officer and criminal justice expert, will walk you through the streets of London, focusing on the history of the police, criminal law, and major crimes that have taken place in London.

In the afternoon you will visit the Crown Prosecution Service, also known as the CPS. Here you will be guided through the prosecution process, and you may find yourself privy to highly sensitive information. Senior figures will explain to you the role of the CPS and how cases are reviewed, as well as offering a detailed insight into the way in which the criminal justice system works. It is particularly important that you are smartly dressed for this visit, with suit and tie for gentlemen, and suits for ladies.

Day 6

Early AM Opening Ceremony at the Tower of London

AM Guided tour of the Tower of London with a focus on corporal punishment.

PM Visit to Victim Support, meeting with Executive Officer

It will be an early start this morning as you will be meeting at The Tower of London at around 8.30 for morning entrance into the opening ceremony. This is a special ceremony, which is only available to view from within the Tower to groups, and involves a military escort and march to open the Tower for the day. One of the main highlights is being able to take photos, which is not allowed when attending the Ceremony of the Keys. After this short ceremony you will meet your guide who will take you round the Tower, discussing the history of the Tower, torture, and the secrets held within, including the mystery of the Princes in the Tower. Entrance to the Crown Jewels is also included.

In the afternoon you will be visiting Victim Support, the National charity for victims of crime in England and Wales. Here you will meet with a member of their executive team, and compare and contrast the support system available for victims of crime.

Day 7

AM Guided tour of The Inns of Court

PM Free afternoon- No AES Activities

6.00PM Farewell Reception at local restaurant.

In the morning you will meet your guide at the Inns of Court. Said to be like a cluster of Oxford or Cambridge Colleges in Central London, your guide will walk you through the historic area, covering a wide variety of different subjects relating to the London Legal system and training of lawyers. To conclude your programme you will have a farewell meal at a local restaurant. This will allow you the opportunity to try some traditional English fare and discuss your programme with your fellow travellers.

Day 8

AM Check out of hotel. Private coach transfer to airport

This morning you will be transported to the airport via private coach for your flight home. We hope you have a safe trip and look forward to welcoming you to London again one day.
