Day 1

AM Arrive in the UK, transfer from airport to accommodation by private coach.

PM Orientation session with Anglo Educational Services staff, and Safety Officer.

PM Guided coach tour of London

Upon arrival in London you will be met by your private motor coach, which will transport you to your accommodation. As check-in is not normally until 3pm, arrangements will have been made with the hotel for you to leave your luggage in a secure area. A pack containing any pre-purchased travelcards, plus directional maps, will have been left for the group leader upon arrival.

An orientation session will be held for you at the Anglo Educational Services Study Centre, Monticello House, in conjunction with AES staff. This session will cover health and safety, how to use public transport as well as offering you helpful hints for your stay.

Following your orientation session you will board your coach for a 2-3 hour guided tour of London with your private guide. Don't forget your camera, as there will be plenty of opportunities for you to disembark the coach and view all that London has to offer. Your coach will drop you back at your accommodations where you will be able to check into your rooms.

Day 2

AM Entrance and guided tour of Wimbledon

PM Entrance and guided tour of Wembley Stadium

Both Wimbledon and Wembley have played host to a wide range of sporting events, from what is considered one of the world's most prestigious tennis tournaments, to the Olympics and the FA Cup Final. In the morning you will be making your way to Wimbledon, where you will participate in a tour of the grounds, learning about the history of not only the Championships, but also the role the English Lawn Tennis Association plays in the UK. Following this, you will proceed to Wembley stadium, with entrance and a tour of the hallowed arch

Day 3

AM Walking tour of the London Olympic sites

PM Meeting with representative from a charity focusing on enabling young people with disabilities to enhance their sporting skills

The Olympics of 2012 had a huge effect, both on the country as a whole and East London, where a number of the venues were based. Your tour this morning will start in the Queen Elizabeth II Olympic Park, taking in a number of the venues and learning about the development of the area, how it has boosted the economy, as well as how local residents feel about the changes. The park is located next to Westfield Stratford City, one of the largest shopping Malls in Europe, so your free time over lunch will allow you to check out the shops before venturing back into the City for your afternoon lecture.

The lecture this afternoon will take place at Monticello House, the Anglo Educational Services Study Centre, located in the heart of Bloomsbury. You will meet with the Founder of a Sports Charity, helping those with disabilities excel in their sporting endeavours. He will cover the work of the charity, Sport in the UK, and how the charity raises and uses their money.

Day 4

AM Entrance and guided tour of Twickenham Stadium

PM Visit to Olympic Training Facility

Evening Theatre production

Twickenham is the home of English rugby. Your tour will cover not only the game, but the management and development of the stadium over the years, sponsorship and training. This ties in nicely with your afternoon visit to one of the Olympic training facilities, where you will learn how elite athletes are trained, the funding made available for those focusing on sports in the UK, and how venues were developed in advance of the Olympic Games in 2012.

In the evening you will be dazzled by some of the stars of London's West End stage, when you visit one of the many theatres in London. This is a must see when you are in the City!

Day 5

AM Visit to Stoke Mandeville Stadium with lecture and tour

PM Visit to Oxford College, and meeting with representative from Oxford University sporting team

Stoke Mandeville Stadium was the birthplace of the Paralympic Games. Your visit to the stadium will demonstrate the work of Dr Ludwig Guttmann, who arranged the first games in 1948 for servicemen with spinal cord injuries. Today the games are an integral part of the Olympics, focusing on ability over disability. Following this you will make your way via private coach to the university town of Oxford. Oxford is famed for its sporting achievements, particularly in rowing.

After free time for lunch in the city, you will meet with representatives from one of the college teams and hear about their training schedule, the history of the sport, and how they fit training in around their gruelling studies.

Day 6

AM Guided tour of Lord's Cricket Ground

PM Guided tour of a football stadium, followed by a football match

Lord's is the home of MCC- Marylebone Cricket Club, which is the world's most famous cricket club. Your tour will focus on the great British game, and the history of the ground. To finish off your stay you will meet with the marketing and events team at a football stadium, and have the opportunity to watch a match- an essential for anyone looking at sporting events in the UK.

Day 7

AM Airport transfer

This morning you will be transported to the airport via private coach for your flight home. We hope you have had a safe trip and look forward to welcoming you to London again one day.
